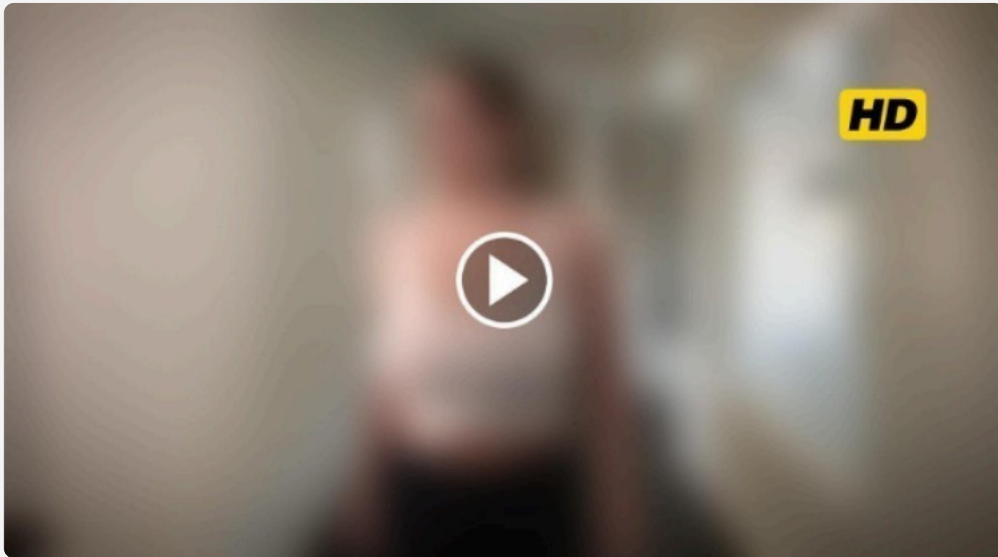

12 MINUTES 46 SECONDS VIRAL VIDEO

The "12 Minutes 46 Seconds" video is a viral video that was posted on May 25, 2020, by Christian Cooper, an African American birdwatcher. The video shows the moment when George Floyd, a 46-year-old African American man, was killed by a police officer in Minneapolis, Minnesota.
